Dear Supporters and Friends,

When I became Executive Director of Methodist Justice Ministry (MJM) in May 2024, I was immediately moved by the heart of this organization—and by the generosity of those who make our work possible. Thank you for being a vital part of MJM's mission to protect and uplift families facing abuse and neglect.

With a background in family law and child welfare, I've seen how life-changing this work can be. I began my career in private practice and later served as a CPS prosecutor, deepening my understanding of the systems meant to protect children. Leading MJM has allowed me to bring that experience to a mission I deeply believe in.

This past year, we have experienced meaningful growth. We welcomed attorney Milan Bolash, once an MJM intern, back to the team. With Milan on board, we now have four attorneys advocating for survivors of abuse. Together, we served over 300 individuals in need of safety and stability.

Thanks to the generosity of our community, our families received support services for healing as they work to rebuild their lives. In December, we hosted our first in-person holiday celebration, complete with crafts, snacks, story time with Santa, and gift distribution to 133 children and their caregivers. These moments of joy and connection are central to our ministry.

We also strengthened partnerships with local agencies, helping us reach more clients in crisis. Collaborating with others allows MJM to broaden its reach and amplify its impact.

Thank you for standing with us. As demand for our services continues to grow, your continued support ensures we meet each need with professionalism, compassion, and hope.

The mission of Methodist Justice Ministry is to provide free legal representation and ongoing support to vulnerable community members impacted by family violence, child abuse, and child neglect.

We exist to provide hope to families in crisis by combining legal expertise with continuing support services for healing. By ensuring that children are with a nurturing and protective caregiver, MJM helps break cycles of abuse and improve outcomes for both the individual and the community.

## What We Do

MJM attorneys file lawsuits in Tarrant and Johnson County's family courts including protective orders, custody, and divorce. We represent victims of physical abuse, sexual abuse, or severe child neglect. Alongside our legal representation, we offer hope beyond the courtroom with essential support services such as counseling and emergency financial aid to help families heal from trauma and regain their independence.







# A Journey to Healing

On a day she'll never forget, Tori endured hours of physical assault by her husband, fueled by drug-induced hallucinations. He hit her repeatedly, held her hostage, and attempted to strangle her. Though not the first instance of abuse, it was the most terrifying—Tori feared she might not survive. As their children's return from school neared, he allowed her to call a friend to pick them up. Moments later, he retrieved a shotgun, placed it between her legs, and said, "Shoot me, take me out of my misery." Tori knew she had to escape. She grabbed the gun, left it by the front door, and fled. Outside, the girls and the family friend saw her injured and desperate for help. Together, they flagged down an off-duty officer, and her husband was arrested in front of their children.

Tori lived with black eyes for weeks, trying to return to her job as a schoolteacher. Healing—physically and emotionally—would take far longer. In the following months, she bravely recounted the trauma to police, prosecutors, and her therapist. Though granted a Protective Order, the path to freedom remained difficult. The District Attorney's Office referred her to MJM for help with family law matters.

MJM supported Tori through her divorce and custody cases, ensuring long-term protections for her and her daughters. They also benefited from MJM's Safe Home Program, Holiday Gift Drive, and free trauma-informed counseling. MJM understands that healing from such trauma is a long process—but with their help, and the support of her therapist, Tori found the courage to face her abuser in court. Today, five years later, she and her daughters are thriving. Tori is stronger, more confident, and finally at peace.


